- The Bible is one <u>Story</u> that tells stories: The Big <u>Story</u> of History in four chapters:
 - 5. Creation

- <u>Redemption</u>
 Restoration
- 6. <u>Fall</u>We need all four chapters:
 - <u>Creation</u>:
 - <u>God</u> is the Creator
 - The world is <u>Given</u> to us, it is not an <u>Accident</u>
 - The world has a <u>Design</u>: It is a particular way
 - The world was made <u>Good</u>
 - The world (<u>Matter</u>) is not bad.
 - Humans were made in <u>God's Image</u>
 - <u>Culture</u> is good, but we must help make and keep it good.
 - o <u>Fall</u>:
 - Every worldview sees the problem: The world is <u>Not</u> the way it's supposed to be.
 - Problems in the world are not because of "<u>Them</u>" us vs. them
 - The fundamental problem with the world is <u>Us</u>: human <u>Sin</u>
 - Sin is the cause of <u>All</u> the problems
 - Advancement in technology will not <u>Save</u> us or make us more <u>Moral</u>
 - o <u>Redemption</u>:
 - God's answer to a broken world: He <u>Came</u> to <u>Save</u> sinners
 - We are <u>All</u> sinners
 - If redemption is available for us, redemption and improvement is <u>Possible</u>
 - God came to <u>Fix</u> it Himself
 - o <u>Restoration</u>
 - History is headed toward a <u>Restored</u> Creation
 - If it was all an Accident, we're just one Mistake from ending it all.
 - We won't merely be <u>Sitting</u> on clouds, but <u>All things</u> will be made new
 - There is <u>Hope</u>

Morality has been shifting, changing questions of what is Right and Wrong,

This change is a <u>Fruit/Symptom</u> of a deeper change in the question: What does it mean to be <u>Human</u>?

- Our <u>Identity</u> should be rooted in overall biblical story:
 - We are made in the Image of God
 - The identity of God includes the <u>Trinity</u>: <u>Father</u>, <u>Son</u>, and <u>Holy Spirit</u>
 - His very identity is grounded in <u>Relationship</u> eternally relational.
 - To understand our relationships means to know how God made us relational.
- We are relational in four ways:
 - <u>Upward</u>:
 - We must have relationship with <u>God</u>
 - God is <u>Higher</u> than we are. (Isaiah 55:8-9)
 - This gives us a fixed <u>Reference</u> point <u>Outside</u> of ourselves.
 - He has to Exist apart from us, and we only exist because He exists.
 - Human <u>Nature</u> is thus based on His nature and being made in His image.
 - It is like a <u>Compass</u> pointing us toward our true <u>Identity</u>, not what we feel.
 - o Inward:
 - Unlike other living things, we have an <u>Awareness</u> of ourselves.
 - We <u>Wonder</u> at why we exist.
 - o <u>Outward</u>:
 - How we <u>Interact</u> with other image bearers.
 - <u>Family</u>Friends

• <u>Community</u> (Coworkers, Schools, etc.)

Nation

- These relationships help us live out our <u>Purpose</u>: the <u>Dominion</u> mandate (Genesis 1:28)
- <u>Downward</u>:
 - We have a relationship with the <u>Creation</u>.
 - Humans are to spread the Garden (Good work and relationship with God: Paradise.)
 - Humans are not Parasites.
 - We have a purpose to <u>Care</u> for God's Creation.
- The <u>Fall</u> ruined these relationships.
 - We all <u>Hide</u> from God and each other.
 - We all feel <u>Shame</u>, especially before God.
 - We Fight against each other
 - Filling and subduing is Hard because of our corruption. (Genesis 3:17-19)
- The <u>Redemption</u> fixes <u>All</u> these relationships.
 - $\circ~$ We can get back to what He created us for: To know Him and enjoy Him and each other.
 - This all leads to the <u>Restoration</u> of this fallen world.
